As part of this, I visited distant local managers, spending time with them to restore trust and communication, and submitted final reports that satisfied all commitments.
- Supported production of plans, budgets and proposals to secure funding for a cholera emergency response (CHF100,000 for 60,000 people). I was the main manager for this operation, which we completed in 3 months, exceeding some targets while meeting budget requirements and completing a full evaluation -- a relative rarity given the complex situation.
- Trained volunteers in sampling, collecting and analysing data, recording them as part of a Rapid Mobile Phone-based (RAMP) survey rollout.
- Developed learning systems; building capacity for staff and volunteers. Developed data collection system that was not language-reliant, nor required high literacy for women-based projects to monitor their own progress.
- · Managed national statistics; reporting on progress, accountability compliance and budgets. In my first month, I helped build a simple map of tests in water quality in refugee camps, data which MSF said was very useful.

Development work

At 24, I found my first and recurring love working for the Red Cross. I have been very fortunate to enjoy a successful career across a broad range of internal and field-based emergency operations and programmes; meeting wonderful people and doing what I love - planning, monitoring, delivering and facilitating development initiatives.

I was often deployed to the field at early onset of disaster, assessing needs and reporting systems needed for a full operation. I settle in quickly, networking with local communities and identifying national talent or training volunteers to take ownership of the work. My flexibility means I take on diverse ad hoc roles in small field teams -representing my organisation at cooperation meets, negotiating with donors, cooperating with other actors, even direct project implementation.

Journalism

I plunged into journalism in my early 30s as a senior reporter for an English daily in media-restricted Brunei. Months into the job, I was tasked with setting up a remote bureau, succeeding on my paper's fourth attempt. My willingness to get close to sources and spend time living in foreign communities allowed me to deliver compelling, insightful, and impactful stories across multiple platforms.

I'm committed to journalistic integrity, and work hard to be accurate and clear in my work. I believe in giving voice to the underserved, turning complex issues into engaging narratives. My editorial experience has made me proficient in overseeing content production, mentoring writers, journalists, and data collectors -- even in communities with literacy issues.

Emerging technology

As a full-time carer at home over the last seven years, I worked remotely in blockchain technology and decentralised finance, chiefly as a content strategist for companies and their users. As a ghostwriter and educator, I am adept at breaking down jargon into engaging learning content.
